## Foundation Awards \$10,000 in Grants During Spring Cycle

The Board of Trustees of the Centerville-Washington Foundation has awarded \$10,000 in grants in its spring cycle, the largest amount distributed in a single cycle in its 19-year history, Judy Budi, chair of the Foundation's grants committee, has announced. The grants went to five area organizations.

"The Foundation is seeking to increase its grants amounts," Budi said. "Last year, the grant awards amounted to \$15,000. Needs are mounting in the community, and the Foundation is committed to help meet them."

The Foundation reviews grant applications two times per year. Deadline for submitting grant applications for the fall cycle is September 1. Deadline for the spring cycle is March 1. A grant of \$2,500 went to Bogg Ministries, a nonprofit organization that delivers food to neighborhoods and communities that are overlooked within thriving or struggling areas. And a grant of \$2,500 went to Food2Go, a project of Living Hope Church. Food2Go serves school children that have been identified by school counselors as being at risk of going hungry during the weekend. Begun by feeding 40 children in 2008, the program will serve 160 children this year.

The Foundation helped support the \$25 million fundraising campaign for an eight-story patient's tower at Children's Hospital with a \$2,000 grant. The new tower will insure that our community's children will continue to have access to quality pediatric healthcare well into the future.

A grant of \$2,000 also went to the YWCA's HomeShare program, a two-year economic empowerment program which offers a transitional housing situation serving homeless, single women and women with children.

The City of Centerville received a \$1,000 grant for a Gold Level Sponsorship of the 2017 Summer Concert Series at Stubbs Park.

The Centerville-Washington Foundation exists to be a community partner for corporate and individual charitable giving, functioning in the formation and preservation of charitable donations, providing services to donors and non-profit organizations, and serving as a source of funds for community groups.
