


**WHEREAS,** Brian Lee Berger of Washington Township, Ohio, has received his prestigious Eagle Scout Award from the Boy Scouts of America.




**WHEREAS,** Brandon W. Letcher of Washington Township, Ohio, has received his prestigious Eagle Scout Award from the Boy Scouts of America.



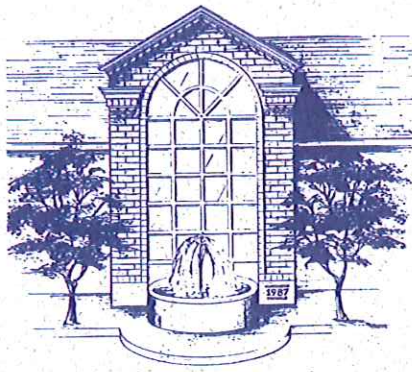

**WHEREAS**, Devin is a senior at Centerville High School and is very active in our community; and




**WHEREAS**, Devin Burke of Washington Township, Ohio, has received his prestigious Eagle Scout award from the Boy Scouts of America.



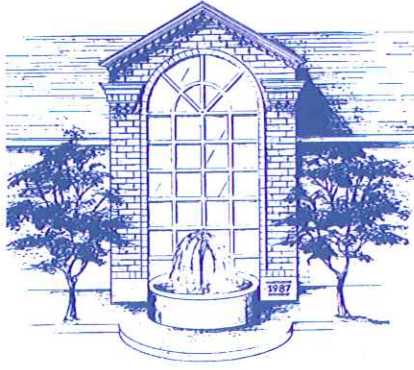

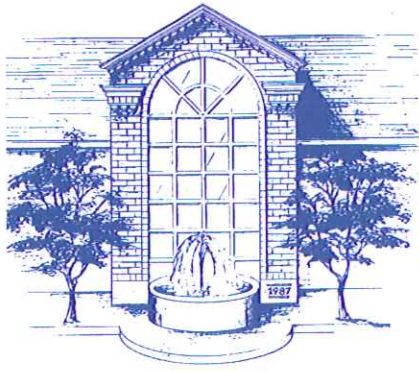
